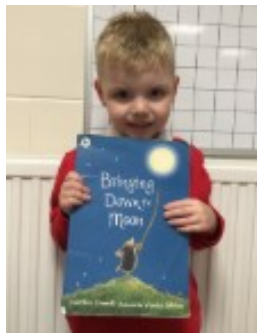

### Term time holiday procedures

Can we please remind you that holidays during term time are not authorised by school.

Penalty Notices are issued by Leeds City Council on our behalf.

• First offence - the first time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount is £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days. This increases to £160 per parent, per child if paid after day 21, until day 28. Any non-payment of the Penalty Notice may be referred to the Magistrates Court.

Second offence (within 3 years) - the second time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be £160 per parent, per child, payable within 28 days. Any non-payment of the Penalty Notice may be referred to the Magistrates Court.

Third offence and any further offences (within 3 years) - the third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case may be presented straight to the Magistrates Court under s444 of the Education Act (1996), or other legal interventions considered. A guilty verdict at the Magistrates Court can lead to a fine of up to £1000 and a criminal record which can affect employment opportunities.
