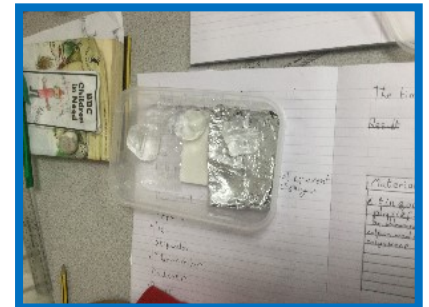
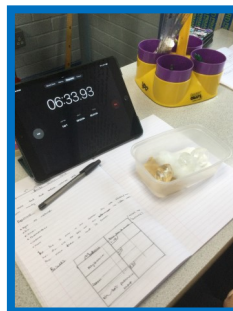
### British Science Week 2026
