- **SENDCOs** have worked together to embed the newly designed Neurodiversity Policy in our schools.
- Termly **joint year group** and **subject leader meetings** provided opportunities for staff to **work together** and **share ideas**.
- **ECTs** have had an opportunity to meet their colleagues and visit each other's schools.
- **Peer to peer reviews** have had a positive impact and provided potential for learning and sharing ideas.
- There are opportunities for all **staff to work together** depending on need.
- **Business Managers** continue to **support each other** with a focus on getting best value.
- **Trustees** have had an opportunity to visit schools to get a better understanding of all the schools in the Trust.
- **Inter-school sporting competitions** in various sports provided more opportunities for children to engage in physical activities and team games.
